Getting there

Car

Take the Northwestern Motorway and exit at Western Springs or Waterview.

Parking: Approximately 60% of the carparks are free and the remaining car parks are pay-anddisplay. The minimum charge is 50c, and if you're parking for the whole day you only pay \$3. These parking charges apply Monday to Friday, between 8am and 5pm.

Public Transport

From Airport: There is an airbus to Auckland city centre called the <u>Auckland Airbus</u> and from there, you can take a train or bus to Unitec. The <u>MAXX</u> website is the link for buses and trains around Auckland. There are also <u>Airport Shuttles</u> that park outside the exit of the Arrival gate at the International Terminal of Auckland airport. You can either book a seat online before you arrive in Auckland or you can find them outside the terminal when you arrive.

Train: 5 minute walk to Mt Albert train station, goes all the way to Downtown Auckland (Britomart).

Bus: Catch one of the many services that go via Pt Chevalier or Mt Albert. Buses depart from Carrington Road or Point Chevalier main road. You can also get on the <u>Outer Link bus</u>, which runs every 15 minutes in a loop from the city out to Unitec.




Australasian Shorebird Conference 2016 - venue

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Pūkorokoro Miranda

Visit the Shorebird Centre and the local bird roost. You'll have the chance to stay clean, or get a little muddy and cross to the shellbank so bring appropriate footwear. With any luck you can have a close up encounter with a Wrybill, and the northern waders will be starting to return so anything could show up. Terrain is easy and there will be a few extra scopes available.

Cost includes a packed lunch, transport and entry fees - \$60.00

Museum followed by birdwatching at Ambury Regional Park.

First stop will be Auckland Museum with a behind-the scenes tour of the bird-collection. Ambury Regional Park and the water-treatment ponds host over 86 bird species, including Royal Spoonbill, Wrybill, Bar-tailed Godwit and Turnstone. Recent rarities include Japanese Snipe.

If you have a flight to catch this field trip is probably your best bet. You'll stay clean and dry and the wader site is close to the airport so taxis won't be too expensive. All costs, including a packed lunch, transport and entry fees are included in the price \$75.00

Other local sites

If you are prepared to get muddy then we have options to go to two other sites, Kidd's shellbanks on the South Manukau (about 1 hour's drive from the conference venue) and Big Sand Island on the Kaipara Harbour (about 2 hours' drive from the conference venue). Both sites require some walking and willingness to get your feet dirty. Price at this point is for a packed lunch only, there will be an extra charge for transport, we'll determine whether these are going and what the final price is when we know how much interest there is in these options, assume around \$50.00 but it could be slightly more or less.

If you sign up for one of these trips we'll contact you closer to the time with an itinerary and final price.

Around Auckland

While heading to Pūkorokoro Miranda and spending time there is a great use of your time it's not the only birding around Auckland.

Tiri Tiri Matangi

The island is an open wildlife sanctuary and home to many rare species. Ferries run from downtown and Gulf Harbour. Check the website for days and times. Accommodation is also available for overnight stays and the chance to see kiwi – but you must book. www.tiritirimatangi.org.nz

Western Springs

Located a short distance from the conference venue, the park is a wildlife sanctuary. Regular birdspecies around the lake include Royal Spoonbill, shags, New Zealand Dabchick and Scaup. http://www.aucklandcouncil.govt.nz/en/parksfacilities/premierparks/pages/westernsprings.aspx

The Hunuas

You'll need a car for the Hunuas, head in to Mangatawhiri Dam and walk an hour and a half up to Piggott's Hut where you have a chance of an encounter with a Kokako. Tomtits are around – you'll need to listen for them, Kaka are also seen here sometimes – take morning tea to have at the hut and listen for odd calls.

Ark in the Park

Head 30mins west to Cascades Kauri Park which is the main entry to the Ark in the Park. This is a partnership between Forest & Bird and Auckland Council, supported by Te Kawerau a Maki. Its aim is to create an open sanctuary in the Waitakere Ranges Regional Park, and return many of the species that once were found in this area.

Tawharanui Regional Park

Drive up north, just over an hour north of Auckland city. A 2.5 kilometre predator-proof fence was built across the peninsula 10 years ago, and many endangered bird species have been released here. Look for Takahe, Brown Teal, Kakariki, Saddleback, Bellbirds and more <u>http://regionalparks.aucklandcouncil.govt.nz/tawharanui</u> Go another half hour to Pakiri and hope for a Fairy Tern.
